WRITING

This term, we will be building on our understanding of sentence structure through exploring syntax and punctuation.

Each week, we will be integrating Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) concepts when practising writing skills. Students will focus on different skills each week such as using more interesting verbs, expanding sentences with adverbs and using apostrophes appropriately.

These skills will support us throughout our History unit of work, where we will be required to write quality information related to important events leading up to the European colonisation of Australia and the effects of these in the years following. Students will also be learning research skills including how to identify the main idea of a text and note taking skills.

READING

During the term, Year 4 students will be focusing on a range of strategies to improve their comprehension and reading stamina through the use of a variety of engaging texts.

Through our shared 'Read Alouds' we will be focussing on increasing our vocabulary by discussing word meanings, synonyms and antonyms to better understand the impact of word choices.

Students will also develop their reading through fluency partners. Students will be paired together to practise reading aloud fluently as well as providing feedback to their peers on their phrasing and expression.





MATHEMATICS

Number and Algebra

Students will review place value including reading and recording numbers in the millions and identifying the value of different digits within a number. Students will investigate skip counting patterns that increase and decrease by 2, 3, 5 and 10.

Additionally, we will explore efficient mental and written strategies for addition and subtraction.

Measurement and Geometry

Students will investigate basic units of measurement related to length. They will use grid coordinates and cardinal points to give and follow directions. This will be further supported through activities at camp.

Statistics and Probability

Students will collect and analyse data about our classmates as we get to know each other, and display this information on bar and pictographs.

UNIT OF WORK

PBL, SEL and MIndfulness

We will spend the first half of the term looking into our four core school values: Respect, Responsible Learner, Resilient and Safe. Students will be developing their class community and establishing shared expectations.

Our explicit Mindfulness teaching this term will focus on parts of the brain and their function, mindful and non-mindful behaviour, developing strong neural pathways in our brain and mindful listening. Mindful activities are practised everyday to support students to be ready for learning.

History

In History, students will be exploring the experiences of people in Australia prior to and following 1788. They will investigate the events, causes and effects of colonisation on people and environments.

SUPPORTING LEARNING AT HOME

Literacy

Read aloud with your child at home. Practise using expression when reading different sentence types. For example, full stops, question marks, exclamation marks, and commas.

Practise writing the four sentence types (statement, command, question and exclamation).

Practise cursive handwriting skills.

Maths

Practise recalling multiplication facts for all times tables up to 10x10. Practise reading and writing numbers up to 10000 and beyond.

History
